Plaintiffs South Jersey Progressive Democrats (“SJPD”), Kate Delany, Susan Druckenbrod, David Stahl, and Rena Margulis (collectively “Plaintiffs”), bring this suit challenging a violation of state law in connection with the fundamental right to vote, equal protection, and associational rights, against the Clerk of the County of Camden, in her official capacity (“County Clerk”) and the Secretary of State as an interested party in her capacity as chief election official for the State of New Jersey (collectively “Defendants”).

This lawsuit is not complicated. A new ballot design law, P.L. 2025, c.32 (hereinafter, “NBL”) (Y.Bromberg Certification, Exhibit B, NBL) was signed into law one month ago on March 6, 2025 with near unanimous approval in the Senate and in the Assembly, including by every member of the Camden delegation, with no reservation offered with regard to the express mandate of the NBL for an oval affixed for each candidate. The law plainly requires that the voter may indicate his or her choice next to the name of *each* candidate for each office with an oval or other appropriate mark, and that the ovals be flushed next to the name of each such candidate, and consistent within and across office blocks. Despite the crystal-clear clarity of the law, the Camden County Clerk’s Office has recently indicated to candidates and the public that it apparently does not intend to honor the oval-mandate of the NBL, and that the County Clerk intends to design the ballot such that voters cannot elect members for county committee individually. The plain statutory violation also implicates related constitutional rights.

PARTIES

1. While the Plaintiff-candidates seeking office are uniquely qualified, their stories are not unique in Camden County where the Defendant Clerk apparently refuses to uniformly allow for the election of individual candidates to county committee. In some municipalities within the County, candidates for such positions have historically been individually elected, while in other municipalities within the county, they have not been. (Exh. F., demonstrating internal consistencies in prior Camden County ballots predating passage of the NBL, and further demonstrating that Camden County ballots allow for voters to select an option on the second page of a ballot.) Nonetheless, the NBL mandates that an “oval or space for the voter to mark a vote shall be to the left or to the right of the name of *each candidate, and each candidate’s name shall appear flush next to and aligned with the oval or space in a consistent manner* which does not create any visual distinction between candidate names.” (Exh. B, NBL, New Section 2(a)(1) (emphasis added.) Accordingly, the NBL amended N.J.S.A. 19:23-25 such that voters are to be instructed on the

ballot to indicate their selection “on the oval or space next to the name of such person.” Note the singular reference. (Exh. B, NBL, Section 6.) The NBL further requires that the candidates be arranged on the ballot such that “[i]mmediately next to the name of *each* candidate for office and position shall be printed an oval or space in which the voter shall indicate the voter’s choice.” (*Id.*, emphasis added.) While the County Clerk for Camden County has yet to provide a printer’s proof of the ballot by the statutory deadline, she has affirmed, via her Deputy County Clerk, her intention to not list an individual oval next to each candidate. This case is very simple, and concerns the basic ability for voters to select, and candidates to run, with, essentially, a bubble selection for voter choice to elect each candidate for each office, as expressly required by the NBL.

2. Plaintiff Kate Delany serves as the head of South Jersey Progressive Democrats and was the elected municipal chair of the Collingswood Democrats from 2019 to 2021. She is a registered voter and is running for the office of county committee in the 2025 Democratic Party Primary in Collingswood, NJ in order to effect change within the Democratic Party in Camden County, and specifically to make sure that the party is active and open to all interested Democrats, and to encourage issues that matter most to the Democrats of the county. She has been the head of South Jersey Progressive Democrats since 2019 and actively organizes with grassroots activists across the region on issues of environmentalism, workers’ rights, public education, social justice, and good government reforms. During her tenure as President, South Jersey Progressive Democrats was active on both issue and electoral campaigns, as well as democracy work. She previously served as a board member of the Good Government Coalition of New Jersey and was active on the campaign for fair ballots in New Jersey. Via South Jersey Progressive Democrats, she is a coalition member of Camden for Clean Air, a grassroots group comprised of members from the city and suburbs working together to advance environmental justice in Camden County. She works as a political organizer for an environmental nonprofit that is focused on opposing the expansion of fossil fuels in New Jersey as well as working to protect safe, affordable public water for all.

3. Plaintiff Susan Druckenbrod is running for the office of county committee in the 2025 Democratic Party Primary in Cherry Hill, NJ. She is a founding member of Cherry Hill Progressive Democrats in 2017, which then expanded to South Jersey Progressive Democrats in 2019. She is a registered voter and is currently running for county committee in Cherry Hill explicitly to represent her district, which presently has no representation, to the larger committee. She works with South Jersey Progressive Democrats to lead and organize across the seven-county region. She is a board member with her faith's legislative advocacy ministry, the Unitarian Universalist Faith Action NJ. Professionally, Susan is an English as a Second Language teacher, having taught to students from all over the world, representing forty countries, who now call South Jersey their home.

4. Plaintiff David Stahl is a registered voter and is running for the office of county committee in the 2025 Democratic Party Primary in Cherry Hill, NJ. He joined South Jersey Progressive Democrats nearly a decade ago to get involved locally with Democratic politics. He joined the organization after endeavoring to get involved directly with the county political party and receiving no responses. He then began increasing his involvement with South Jersey Progressive Democrats by joining a slate of candidates to run as a committee member in 2019. He grew up in Gloucester County, obtained a B.A. in Theater, and then a Master's (MS) in Business Analytics, both from Temple University. He has lived in Cherry Hill since 2015.

5. Plaintiff Rena Margulis is a registered voter and is running for the office of county committee in the 2025 Democratic Party Primary in Cherry Hill, NJ. She has been a resident of Cherry Hill since 2002 and is a founding member of South Jersey Progressive Democrats. In 2017, she was part of the organizing effort in Cherry Hill to run candidates for the office of county committee. She has also previously run for the office of County Clerk. She has been very vocal and involved in organizing a fair ballot in New Jersey and is a regular attendee of the Camden County Board of Elections meetings.

6. Plaintiff South Jersey Progressive Democrats (SJPD) was and is the primary independent Democratic Party organization in South New Jersey. SJPD is comprised of progressive Democratic party voters, candidates and representatives across South Jersey. SJPD believes in social, political and economic justice, including environmental justice, and supports candidates for county committee and various other local, county and state offices to ensure that party and elected officials reflect the values of fairness, equality, and justice for all, and open and transparent government.

7. Defendant Pamela R. Lampitt is the Clerk of the County of Camden, who is vested with certain statutory duties and obligations including the designing and printing of sample ballots, machine ballots, and mail-in ballot materials, the issuance of mail-in ballots, and conducting a drawing for ballot positions for county elections held in Camden County.

8. Interested Party Secretary of State Tahesha Way is designated the “chief State election official” pursuant to N.J.S.A. § 19:31-6a, and is listed here as an interested party.

JURISDICTION AND VENUE

9. The Superior Court has jurisdiction over this election matter pertaining to ballots with respect to the Democratic Primary Election to be held on June 10, 2025.

10. Venue is proper in Camden County under R. 4:3-2(a)(2) because, although the law at issue was adopted in Mercer County and is overseen statewide by the Secretary of State as chief election official pursuant to N.J.S.A. § 19:31-6a from offices in Mercer County, the pertinent action of ballot design and its production arises in Camden County.

BACKGROUND

11. Primary elections for the Democratic and Republican parties are scheduled to take place throughout the State on June 10, 2025 to determine, among other things, the composition of county party committee membership. (See Exh. C, 2025 NJ Election Calendar.)

12. County clerks, in carrying out their duties, are subject to certain restrictions and obligations, as set forth in the NBL, such that “[a]ll primary election ballots used in this State shall

comply with [specific] design standards” including “(1) the oval or space for the voter to mark a vote shall be to the left or to the right of the name of each candidate, and each candidate’s name shall appear flush next to and aligned with the oval or space in a consistent manner which does not create any visual distinction between candidates.” (Exh. B, NBL) (New Section 2(a)(1).)

13. The NBL further requires that “all office blocks appearing on one ballot shall be designed according to the same standards of design, consistent with the provisions of this section” and prescribes related duties for county clerks. (Exh B, NBL) (New Section 2(a)(4).)

14. The NBL further specifies text to be printed on the ballot to “instructing the voter how to indicate the voter’s choice for each office and position, and for how many persons to vote for each office and position: To vote for any person whose name is printed on this ballot mark a cross x, plus +, check, or an otherwise appropriate mark on the oval or space next to the name of such person.” (Exh B, NBL) (N.J.S.A. 19:23-25, as amended by NBL.)

15. The NBL further amends N.J.S.A. 19:23-25 in specifying the design of each office block, such that “Immediately next to the name of each candidate for office and position shall be printed an oval or space in which the voter shall indicate the voter’s choice.” (Exh B, NBL, N.J.S.A. 19:23-25, as amended by NBL.)

16. The NBL was developed following extensive public hearings, passed both houses, and was signed into law by Governor Murphy on March 6, 2025.

17. Pursuant to N.J.S.A. 19:23-24, county clerks are to conduct public draws for candidate placement on the ballots at 3pm on April 3, 2025. (Exh C, NJ Election Calendar.)

18. During the ballot drawing on April 3, 2025, the Camden County Deputy Clerk acknowledged that the NBL requires the placement of an individual oval next to each candidate’s name, but did not feel that the Clerk’s office needed to comply with this requirement. (Y.Bromberg Certification, ¶ 9, Recording of Camden Ballot Draw.)

19. Pursuant to N.J.S.A. 19:14-1, April 4, 2025 marks the deadline for the preparation of official primary election ballots for printing. Accordingly, N.J.S.A. 19:14-1 further directs that “[e]very county clerk shall have ready for the printer” on this day “a copy of the contents of official ballots as hereinafter required to be printed for use at such [primary] election. The county clerk shall also on or before that time place another copy of such contents on file in the county clerk’s office and keep the same open to public inspection until the sample ballots hereinafter provided to be printed shall have to be distributed.”

20. Pursuant to N.J.S.A. 19:13-12, April 5, 2025 marks the deadline for filing in Superior Court to protect a primary election candidate’s right. Because April 5 falls on a Saturday, the Court Rules direct that the deadline is the end of the day on Monday April 7, 2025, N.J. Rules of Court 1:3-1, although it should be noted that the election-related deadlines are generally interpreted liberally by New Jersey courts for the purposes of ensuring the conduct of fair elections.

21. The deadline to file in Superior Court is scheduled after the deadline for the clerks to offer printer’s proofs for review for public inspection, so that a candidate may accordingly pursue judicial relief to protect or enforce his or her rights.

22. Nonetheless, on April 4, 2025, the County Clerk did not provide a copy of the printer proof of the ballot for public inspection. (Y.Bromberg Certification, ¶ 10.) Moreover, the Deputy County Clerk repeated his position on behalf of the Clerk’s Office, which he first articulated the day prior during the ballot draw, that individual ovals would not be placed alongside each candidate for each office on Camden County ballots.

23. At some point, the Clerk’s Office did post online information of county candidate lists for office. *See* Camden County Candidates List – 2025 Primary, *available at*: https://www.camdencounty.com/wp-content/elections/primary2025/2025_Primary_Candidates_List.pdf (accessed on April 6, 2025, and on file) (incorporated hereto as Exh. D.)

2025 Cherry Hill, NJ Ballots

24. The 2025 Camden County Candidates List provides that the election for members of county committee in Cherry Hill, NJ will be a “Vote for Seventy-Four” race, meaning that there are seventy-four (74) open positions for office to be presented to voters across Cherry Hill. There are seventy-seven (77) candidates for this position: three (3) of which were drawn first for the ballot, under the slogan South Jersey Progressive Democrats: Plaintiffs Druckenbrod, Stahl, and Margulis. The remaining seventy-four (74) candidates are affiliated with the Camden County Democrat Committee, Inc. (See Exh. D, 2025 Camden County Candidates List.)

25. If voters are not able to individually select candidates of their choice for county committee, as is currently represented as the position of the Camden County Clerk’s Office, then in a “Vote for Seventy-Four” race, they will have to choose to vote for a grouping of three (3) candidates, *and therefore undervote and be disenfranchised as to the ability to vote for the remaining seventy-one (71) open seats, and will not be able to vote for more than three candidates notwithstanding that there are seventy-four candidates running for office*, or vote for a grouping of seventy-four (74) candidates. Voters may therefore not choose to vote for the slate of three (3), no matter how much they want to vote for the SJPD or those Plaintiff-Candidates, simply to avoid disenfranchisement of (71) open seats on the ballot. (See Exh. E, Certifications by voters of Cherry Hill and Collingswood describing the harms associated with being robbed of the right to individually select their representatives on the local level.)

26. As a critical threshold matter, it is likely that significant voter confusion will result in Cherry Hill, NJ, including potential overvotes, where every other option on the ballot offers an individual bubble selection for each candidate (as required by the NBL, and as customary and required in New Jersey elections), but where the Cherry Hill county committee race *instructs voters to “Vote for Seventy-Four” although they apparently will only be allowed to make two actual selections on the ballot*. It is unreasonable to expect voters to count out seventy-four (74)

candidates; they could accidentally miscount if they are voting by hand; voters cannot just assume that one slate has enough candidates for every open seat.

27. This effectively means that Cherry Hill voters cannot vote for the individual candidates who they may personally know from local community events, and are forced to choose between one grouping or another, rather than individual selections independent of groupings and across groupings in furtherance of their choice of proportional representation among tickets. (See Exh E, Certification by Cherry Hill voter describing concerns of the clerk's "apparent resistance to offering voters an opportunity to independently select their preferred candidates" in furtherance of a ballot design "to limit and almost force a line-vote. It does not allow a voter to 'mix and match' their preferred candidates" or to exercise their full rights "to select my representatives of choice.")). (See Exh E, Certification by Cherry Hill voters describing their prior ability as Merchantville voters in Camden County "to choose to vote for county committee candidates whom we knew and were aligned with our values by selecting candidates individually" but that they learned "as Cherry Hill voters" that they "must choose an entire slate of candidates, rather than our own 'collection' of individuals" whom they "feel worthy of our votes, based on what we know about each candidate.").

28. By extension, it means that Cherry Hill candidates must campaign and communicate to voters that they effectively need to choose for one grouping or the other, and that voters do not have a direct choice in their proportional representation for county committee.

29. It also means that if Cherry Hill voters select the first of the only two options presented to them, notwithstanding that the election is for a "Vote for Seventy-Four," and that such instruction is specified on the ballot in accordance to the NBL, the remaining open seventy-one (71) seats on the municipal committee will be subject to appointment, rather than a vote by the voters, thereby removing direct agency from the voters to select the individual candidates of their choosing, and to so elect for all seventy-four (74) open offices available.

30. Furthermore, to the extent that voters are not confused about the instruction to “Vote for Seventy-Four” although there are only two actual selections on the ballot, the three (3) Cherry Hill Plaintiff-Candidates will be harmed due to voters being drawn to the selection of a fuller slate when a single bubble option is offered for comparatively more positions. To the extent that the voters are confused about the instruction, the three (3) Cherry Hill Plaintiff-Candidates will be harmed due to the likelihood of ballot overvotes and due to the lack of standardization of the ballot design for this unique office.

31. As a result of ongoing ballot manipulation, South Jersey Progressive Democrats have understandably had difficulty recruiting candidates for office in Cherry Hill when doing so has proved to be a fruitless endeavor. For example, South Jersey Progressive Democrats in 2017 and 2019 ran full and almost full slates for county committee in Cherry Hill, on notorious county-line ballot designs which are no longer in use due to the use of a combination of potential phantom candidates, different slogans on a shared line, comparative lighter weight of the line, and obtaining far-flung ballot real estate such as in Column 7. (Exh G, Prior Cherry Hill ballots.) None of the SJPD candidates were elected into office in 2017 and 2019; it is worth noting that county committee races in Cherry Hill similarly offered only one oval for slate selection. There was no chance for individual candidates for county committee to be individually voted for, although individual county committee candidates in some other municipalities within Camden County *were* afforded individual ovals, and although voters are able to vote on a second page of the ballot. (Exh. F, Internal Inconsistencies among Prior Camden Ballots, and demonstrating the ability of voters to cast a vote on the second page of the ballot.)

Collingswood, NJ 2025 Ballots.

32. The 2025 Camden County Candidates List provides that the election for members of county committee in Collingswood Borough, NJ will be a “Vote for Eighteen” race, meaning that there are eighteen (18) open positions for office to be presented to the voters across

Collingswood. There are nineteen (19) candidates for this position: one (1) who was drawn for first for the ballot, under the slogan South Jersey Progressive Democrats: Plaintiff Kate Delany, and eighteen (18) affiliated with the slogan Camden County Democrat Committee, Inc. (See Exh D, 2025 Camden County Candidates List.)

33. If voters are not able to individually select candidates of their choice for county committee, then in a “Vote for Eighteen” race, they will have to choose to vote for a grouping of one (1) candidate, *and therefore undervote and be disenfranchised as to the ability to vote for the remaining seventeen (17) open seats, and will not be able to vote for more than one candidate notwithstanding that there are eighteen candidates running for office*, or vote a grouping of eighteen (18) candidates. Voters may therefore not choose to vote for the slate of (1), no matter how much they want to vote for Plaintiff Kate Delany or SJPD, simply to avoid disenfranchisement of seventeen (17) open seats on the ballot.

34. As a critical threshold matter, it is likely that significant voter confusion will result in Collingswood, NJ, including potential overvotes, where every other option on the ballot offers an individual bubble selection for each candidate (as required by the NBL, and as customary and required in New Jersey elections), but where the county committee race *instructs voters to “Vote for Eighteen” although they apparently will only be allowed to make two actual selections on the ballot*. It is unreasonable to expect voters to count out eighteen (18) candidates; they could accidentally miscount if they are voting by hand; voters cannot just assume that one slate has enough candidates for every open seat.

35. This effectively means that Collingswood voters cannot vote for the individual candidates who they may personally know from local community events, and are forced to choose between one grouping or another, rather than individual selections independent of groupings and even across groupings in furtherance of their choice of proportional representation among tickets. (See Exh E, Certification by Collingswood voter describing that “county committee races are

unique because they are so local and it's possible to have personal relationships with multiple candidates, or meet many candidates during the campaign," resulting in a voter "knowing multiple candidates who align with your values," and that preventing voters to "choose individual candidates for the position of county committee based on these shared values" interferes with voters' "ability to choose candidates based on their political values and my own research, which is a key part of participating in a democracy.") (See Exh. E, Certification by Collingswood voter describing stating that "it sounds obvious, but being able to vote for candidates who may or may not have been endorsed by the county party, aren't running together, and may not even like each other is, if not the essence of democracy, an example of it. Denying voters the option of voting for individual candidates rather than a block of candidates, some of whom they may like but some of whom they won't, defeats the purpose of voting: that you can choose ALL the candidates you like, not just some of them.").

36. By extension, it means that Collingswood candidates must campaign and communicate to voters that they effectively need to choose for one grouping or the other, and that voters do not have a direct choice in their proportional representation for county committee.

37. It also means that if Collingswood voters select the first of the only two options presented to them, notwithstanding that the election is for a "Vote for Eighteen," and that such instruction is specified on the ballot in accordance with the NBL, the remaining open seventeen (17) seats on the municipal committee will be subject to appointment, rather than a vote by the voters, thereby removing direct agency from the voters to select the individual candidates of their choosing, and to so elect for all eighteen (18) open offices available.

38. Furthermore, to the extent that voters are not confused about the instruction to "Vote for Eighteen" although there are only two actual selections on the ballot, the Collingswood Plaintiff-Candidate will be harmed due to voters being drawn to the selection of a fuller slate when a single bubble option is offered for comparatively more positions. To the extent that the voters

are confused about the instruction, the Collingswood Plaintiff-Candidates will be harmed due to the likelihood of ballot overvotes and due to the lack of standardization of the ballot design for this unique office.

39. As a result of ongoing ballot manipulation, South Jersey Progressive Democrats have understandably had difficulty recruiting candidates for office in Collingswood when doing so has proved to be a fruitless endeavor. For example, in 2021, Plaintiff Delany ran as an incumbent-candidate for county committee, on a slate of sixteen (16) candidates, who were mostly comprised of incumbent-candidates. No one on this 2021 SJPD slate was elected to office due to ballot manipulation that has been endemic in Camden County and in New Jersey such as the comparative weight of the line and Ballot Siberia. (Exh G, Prior Collingswood ballots.) In 2023, a smaller slate of SJPD ran for county committee, discouraged by ongoing, notorious ballot manipulation. Again, no one on this 2023 SJPD slate was elected to office. It is worth noting that in 2021 and 2023, county committee races in Collingswood similarly offered only one oval for slate selection; there was no chance for individual candidates to be individually voted for, although individual county committee candidates in some other municipalities within Camden County *were* afforded individual ovals, and although prior Camden County ballots demonstrate the ability for voters to cast a vote on the second page of the ballot. (Exh. F, Internal Inconsistencies among Prior Camden Ballots.)

40. Candidates for office are not required to, nor should they be required to, associate with and run a full slate of candidates in order to be fairly treated on the ballot and have an equal opportunity to be elected into office, particularly in connection with the ability to represent their local neighborhood and local neighborhood interests. The rights of the Plaintiff-Candidates have accordingly been infringed.

41. Voters are not required to, nor should they be required to, be limited in their right of association and election of candidates listed on the ballots, even if those candidates are associated with different slogans. The rights of the Plaintiff-Candidates have accordingly been infringed, as candidates themselves whose supporters want to vote for them free of infringement, and as voters themselves insofar as they want to cast a vote for their own slate of three (3) or one (1), respectfully, and for certain candidates among their seventy-one (71) or seventeen (17), respectfully, remaining choices for candidate-selection, notwithstanding that those neighbors may be associated with a different slogan.

42. New Jersey state and federal law has recognized that candidates have the right to associate, and by extension, the right not to associate. In pertinent part, the District Court decisions which compelled the passage of the NBL recognized that the right not to associate applies to candidates forced to recruit and associate with a full slate of candidates in order to secure favorability and avoid penalization in ballot design, and that the ballot should be free from manipulation such that candidates are treated unequally. These principles apply by extension to the rights of voters to ensure the basic tenets of ballot fairness and clarity.

43. Moreover, the NBL supports this principle by requiring ovals for each candidate for each office. After extensive public hearings in which the Defendant County Clerk, who was then-a member of the Assembly, and in which the entire Camden delegation participated without raising objection or any caveats or amendment, the NBL was passed to cure various problematic features of prior ballot design law in New Jersey, which voters and candidates across the state are now the beneficiaries of.

44. The state legislature balanced the potential for voter confusion and ballot arrangements, and expressly provided new language, repeatedly throughout the NBL, to specify that every candidate gets a bubble for every office. No exceptions were provided by law. *Why did the legislature go out of its way to affirm this repeatedly in the NBL?* The NBL offers a ray of

sunshine for candidates and voters across New Jersey, including in Camden County, and provides **an unusually clear mandate** as to the assignment of an oval, standardized between and among offices, for each candidate and each office.

45. N.J.S.A. 19:34-25 further mandates, as amended by the NBL, that specific voter instructions be printed on the ballot: “Below this rule [setting apart the heading of the ballot from the body of the ballot] *shall* be printed the following directions instructing the voter how to indicate *the voter’s choice for each office and position*, and for how many persons to vote for each office and position: *To vote for any person whose name is printed upon this ballot mark a cross x , plus + , check, or any otherwise appropriate mark on the oval or space next to the name of such person.*” (Exh B, New Ballot Law, Section 6) (emphasis added.)

46. N.J.S.A. 19:34-25 further mandates that below the aforementioned instruction to the voter to be printed on the ballot, “shall be printed a heavy diagram rule below which shall be printed the government levels describing the offices to be voted for below which shall be separate office blocks headed by the titles of offices and positions for which candidates are to be voted for at the primary election, together with such directions to the voter as may be necessary. *“Vote for one,” “Vote for two,” or a greater number, as the case may be, shall be included with any other direction to the voters, and shall be printed in an obvious and conspicuous manner.*” (Exh B, New Ballot Law, Section 6) (emphasis added.)

47. N.J.S.A. 19:34-25 further mandates the ballot design such that *“immediately next to the name of each candidate for office and position shall be printed an oval or space in which the voters shall indicate the voter’s choice.* A heavy diagram rule shall be used between each office block. The ballot shall be so arranged that all candidates seeking the same office are listed in one contiguous office block. No candidate shall be separated from other candidates seeking the same office on the ballot.” (Exh B, New Ballot Law, Section 6) (emphasis added.)

48. Should the Camden County Clerk proceed to design the ballot in such a manner which does not designate an individual office or space in which the voter shall indicate the voter's choice, doing so is in direct contradiction with multiple provisions of the NBL which expressly provide for this ballot design in the individual selection of candidates, as additionally embedded in the specific instructions to be printed on the ballot for the voters to understand how to vote. Doing so also directly conflicts with general ballot design mandates in the NBL including for consistency of formatting across the ballot, as delineated in New Section 2(a)(5)(emphasis added) which specifies that "all spacing, ruling, and delineation of candidates shall be *consistent and uniform* within each office block and across all office blocks included on each ballot, so as not to create a separation or visual distinction between the names of any candidates," and in such a manner as to avoid voter confusion, such as in New Section 2(a)(2) which specifies that "all text shall be written in plain, simple language, to the extent possible, and shall avoid overly technical language."

49. Notably, the NBL does not extend any discretion to the County Clerk to withhold a separate oval or appropriate space for the selection of each candidate for each office, nor does it create any exceptions to the rule.

50. Indeed, among the stated purposes of the NBL, the Legislature recognized that "As the most critical stage in the electoral process is the instant before the vote is cast, the design for the new primary election ballot seeks to: (1) ensure that voters can understand the ballot; (2) maintain a manageable ballot; (3) reduce voter confusion; (4) provide voters with information as to the policy positions and endorsements of the candidates running for office; and (5) allow voters to quickly find their preferred choice of candidate for a given office and cast their vote." (Exh B, NBL, New Section 1(j)).

51. The Defendant County Clerk's proposed abandonment of an individual voter choice selection associated with each candidate for each office runs counter to the Legislature's

stated purpose to ensure an understandable, manageable ballot which reduces voter confusion and allows voters to quickly find their preferred choice of candidate for a given office and cast such vote.

52. Further, the NBL provides that the “Secretary of State, in consultation with all county clerks, shall promulgate uniform guidelines for all county clerks to follow in order to comply with the requirements of this section.” (Exh B, NBL, New Section 2.)

53. April 19, 2025 marks the commencement of mailing of mail-in ballots for primary election. (See Exh C, 2025 Primary Election Timeline).

54. May 29, 2025 marks the commencement of mailing sample ballots for the primary election. (See Exh C, 2025 Primary Election Timeline).

55. The early voting period is June 3 – June 8, 2025. (See Exh C, 2025 Primary Election Timeline).

56. Primary Election Day is June 10, 2025. (See Exh C, 2025 Primary Election Timeline).

57. The roles and responsibilities of County Committee representatives include the endorsement of candidates for nomination to the voters, the ability to vote for and fill vacancies, and pursuant to the NBL, the selection of representatives to the State Committee of any political party. On a more practical level, County Committee representatives, particularly on the municipal-level, i.e., where they comprise the Municipal Committee, are elected to advance the localized interests of their neighbors, and invest in this relationship with their neighbor-constituents in a multitude of ways, for example, by holding public meetings to discuss matters of import and to hear from constituents, by facilitating voter registration drives, by hosting special topic forums on issues such as environmental action or housing or immigration or public benefits, and by keeping constituents informed of local, county, and state issues. Or, as Tocqueville described in “Democracy in America,” a foundational document describing American exceptionalism: “*local*

assemblies of citizens constitute the strength of free nations. Town-meetings are to liberty what primary schools are to science; they bring it within the people's reach, they teach men how to use and how to enjoy it. A nation may establish a system of free government, but without the spirit of municipal institutions it cannot have the spirit of liberty.”

FIRST COUNT

Violation of New Ballot Law and related constitutional protections in connection with the fundamental right to vote, equal protection under law, the freedoms of choice and association, and the New Jersey Civil Rights Act

58. Plaintiffs repeat and reassert all the allegations set forth in the foregoing paragraphs as if set forth herein at length.

59. The NBL clearly directs that “all primary election ballots used in this State shall comply with the following design standards: (1) *the oval or space for the voter to mark a vote shall be to the left or to the right of the name of each candidate, and each candidate's name shall appear next to and aligned with the oval or space in a consistent manner* which does not create any visual distinction between candidate names; (2) all text shall be written in *plan, simple language*, to the extent possible, and shall avoid overly technical language; . . . (4) *all office blocks appearing on one ballot shall be designed according to the same standards of design*, consistent with the provisions of this section; (5) all spacing, ruling and delineation of candidates shall be *consistent and uniform within each office block and across all office blocks* included on each ballot, so as not to create a separation or visual distinction between the names of any candidates.” (Exh B, NBL, New Section 2(a)) (emphasis added).

60. The county clerk is further directed to design the ballot with specific text and instruction to be placed on the ballot which specifies that the voter is informed to “indicate the voter's choice for each office and position, and for how many persons to vote for each office and position” and specifically that the instructions on the ballot read: “To vote for any person whose

name is printed upon this ballot mark a cross x , plus +, check, or an otherwise appropriate mark *on the oval or space next to the name of such person*” and that further in the body of the ballot, the voter be instructed in connection with the appropriate office block for county committee: “Vote for one,’ ‘Vote for two,’ or a greater number, as the case may be, *shall* be included with any other directions to the voters, and shall be printed in an obvious and conspicuous manner.” (Exh B, NBL, Section 6, N.J.S.A. 19:23-25, as amended) (emphasis added).

61. The NBL is replete with language specifying that an oval is to be included for each candidate for each office, and is replete with language referring to voter choice. The legislative findings supporting passage of the NBL reiterate the need to ensure an understandable, manageable ballot which reduces voter confusion and allows voters to quickly find their preferred choice of candidate for a given office and cast their vote, and reiterates the need for standardized, uniform, and user-friendly design principles.

62. The County Clerk of Camden County lacks discretion to choose whether or not to place an oval or space next to the name of each candidate for each office.

63. The failure to allow for an individual selection of each candidate for each office by affixing an oval or space next to the name of each candidate for each office is an obvious violation of the new ballot design law, P.L. 2025, c.32.

64. The failure to implement this statutory requirement further violates the right to equal protection of the laws as enshrined in the New Jersey Constitution art. I, ¶ 1 and the Fourteenth Amendment of the U.S. Constitution; related freedom of speech and freedom of association rights similarly enshrined in the New Jersey Constitution Article I, Section 6 and the First Amendment of the U.S. Constitution; and the fundamental right to vote for a candidate for elective office of one’s choosing as guaranteed by the New Jersey Constitution art. 2, § 1, ¶ 3 and the Fourteenth Amendment.

65. These statutory and constitutional rights are each implemented by N.J.S.A. 10:6-2(c) of the New Jersey Civil Rights Act, in connection with the fundamental right to vote, the freedom of choice and association (including the right not to associate) in connection with same, and the right to equal treatment on the ballot.

66. These statutory and constitutional provisions are intended to ensure election integrity and voter choice in connection with ballot design, and place clear obligations on the part of the Defendant County Clerk with respect to the design of the ballot as prescribed by the NBL.

67. The statutory and constitutional provisions set forth above are intended to protect Plaintiffs' rights to run for office and be elected to same, to ensure equal treatment on the ballot, to ensure that voters have a clear and functional ballot which avoids confusion or ballot manipulation, such that elections are conducted in a fair and impartial manner and such that they *mean* something, and place clear obligations on the part of Defendant County Clerk to design a ballot ensuring that a voter may individually select candidates for office, ensuring that the ballot avoids voter confusion including the possibility of over-voting, and assigns equal weight to all votes for office.

68. Plaintiffs' rights have been invaded by the Clerk's arbitrary and capricious actions.

69. Plaintiffs' rights have been invaded by the Clerk's actions contrary to law.

70. The Defendant County Clerk deprived Plaintiffs of their substantive rights.

71. The Defendant County Clerk's deprivation of Plaintiffs' rights occurred "under color of law," as she was acting in her official capacity.

72. Plaintiffs are entitled to damages and to reasonable attorney's fees and costs pursuant to N.J.S.A. 10:6-2(f) and N.J.S.A. 10:5-27.1.

WHEREFORE, Plaintiffs demand judgment as follows:

A. On a temporary, preliminary, and permanent basis, compelling the County Clerk of Camden County to prepare all ballots with respect to the June 10, 2025 Primary Election in Cherry

Hill and in Collingswood that ensures an individual oval or space to allow voters to vote for each candidate for each office on the ballot, including the offices of county committee members, in a manner which complies with the NBL, the right to vote, the right to equal protection, and the right of association (and the right not to associate) under the Federal and State Constitutions, the New Jersey Civil Rights Act, and with Title 19's mandates for ballot design such that an individual oval or space is indicated alongside each candidate for each office, including for county committee, in a manner that is consistent within and across office blocks; and

B. Preliminarily enjoining and restraining the Camden County Clerk from preparing, printing, or disseminating any provisional, emergency, sample, vote-by-mail, overseas, military, machine, paper, electronic, and/or any other form of ballot in connection with the June 10, 2025 Democratic Primary Election in the Borough of Collingswood and in Cherry Hill in such a manner that prevents an individual election for each candidate for each office with the placement of an oval or space in a consistent manner within and across offices on the ballot, until the issues raised in the Verified Complaint in this matter are fully adjudicated; and

C. Compelling the County Clerk to prepare ballots with respect to all primary elections in Collingswood and Cherry Hill moving forward that feature an individual oval for each office for each candidate on the ballot, so as to treat candidates for office, including candidates for county committee, equally on the ballot, and so that the weight of such votes may be treated equally; and

D. Ordering an expedited briefing schedule to ensure that the issues raised in this Verified Complaint in this matter are resolved prior to the important election deadlines set forth in Title 19, including, but not limited to, the April 19, 2025 deadline for the commencement of mailing of mail-in ballots; and

E. Awarding Plaintiffs damages and all reasonable attorney's fees and costs in connection with this matter, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 10:6-2(f) and N.J.S.A. 10:5-27.1; and

F. Granting such other relief as it may deem right and just upon the determination of this matter.

SECOND COUNT

Action in Lieu of Prerogative Writ Pursuant to R. 4:69-1 *et seq.*

73. Plaintiffs repeat and reassert all the allegations set forth in the foregoing paragraphs as if set forth herein at length.

74. The Camden County Clerk erred in failing to place an individual oval or space allowing for the election of each candidate for each office, in violation of the NBL.

75. The Camden County Clerk lacks discretion pursuant to the NBL to refuse to place an individual oval or space allowing for the election of each candidate for each office.

76. The Clerk's actions are arbitrary and capricious.

77. The clerk's actions are contrary to law.

WHEREFORE, Plaintiffs demand judgment as follows:

A. On a temporary, preliminary, and permanent basis, compelling the County Clerk of Camden County to prepare all ballots with respect to the June 10, 2025 Primary Election in Cherry Hill and in Collingswood that ensures an individual oval or space to allow voters to vote for each candidate for each office on the ballot, including the offices of county committee members, in a manner which complies with the NBL, the right to vote, the right to equal protection, and the right of association (and the right not to associate) under the Federal and State Constitutions, the New Jersey Civil Rights Act, and with Title 19's mandates for ballot design such that an individual oval or space is indicated alongside each candidate for each office, including for county committee, in a manner that is consistent within and across office blocks; and

B. Preliminarily enjoining and restraining the Camden County Clerk from preparing, printing, or disseminating any provisional, emergency, sample, vote-by-mail, overseas, military, machine, paper, electronic, and/or any other form of ballot in connection with the June 10, 2025

Democratic Primary Election in the Borough of Collingswood and in Cherry Hill in such a manner that prevents an individual election for each candidate for each office with the placement of an oval or space in a consistent manner within and across offices on the ballot, until the issues raised in the Verified Complaint in this matter are fully adjudicated; and

C. Compelling the County Clerk to prepare ballots with respect to all primary elections in Collingswood and Cherry Hill moving forward that feature an individual oval for each office for each candidate on the ballot, so as to treat candidates for office, including candidates for county committee, equally on the ballot, and so that the weight of such votes may be treated equally; and

D. Ordering an expedited briefing schedule to ensure that the issues raised in this Verified Complaint in this matter are resolved prior to the important election deadlines set forth in Title 19, including, but not limited to, the April 19, 2025 deadline for the commencement of mailing of mail-in ballots; and

E. Awarding Plaintiffs damages and all reasonable attorney's fees and costs in connection with this matter, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 10:6-2(f) and N.J.S.A. 10:5-27.1; and

F. Granting such other relief as it may deem right and just upon the determination of this matter.

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PRELIMINARY STATEMENT

Plaintiffs South Jersey Progressive Democrats (“SJPDP”) and four directly impacted individual SJPDP candidates for Camden County Committee – Kate Delany, Rena Margulis, Susan Druckenbrod, and David Stahl (collectively “Plaintiffs”) – bring this action seeking to temporarily restrain and permanently enjoin Defendant Pamela R. Lampitt, the Clerk of the County of Camden (the “County Clerk”), from designing ballots to be circulated to the voters of Cherry Hill and Collingswood, NJ, and printing and mailing those ballots for the June 10, 2025 Primary Election (the “Primary Election”), in such a manner that does not designate a separate oval or space next to each candidate for each office, including for county committee offices, in a uniform manner within and across office block, as mandated by the new ballot design law, P.L. 2025, c.32 (hereinafter “NBL”).

The failure to follow this clear and unambiguous statutory mandate violates the equal protection of the laws as enshrined in the New Jersey Constitution art. I, ¶ 1 and the Fourteenth Amendment, Plaintiffs’ and the voters’ fundamental right to vote as enshrined in the New Jersey Constitution art. 2, § 1, ¶ 3 and the Fourteenth Amendment, and Plaintiffs’ and the voters’ First Amendment rights of association and speech, as clearly identified under both United States Supreme Court and New Jersey State Court jurisprudence, and most recently by the United States District Court for the District of New Jersey and the Third Circuit Court of Appeals with respect to New Jersey ballot design. See e.g., Conforti v. Hanlon, No. 20-8267, 2023 WL 2744020 (D.N.J. March 31, 2023); Kim v. Hanlon, No. 24-1098 (D.N.J. March 29, 2024); Kim v. Hanlon, 24-1594 (3d Cir. 2024).

At issue is the failure to follow the express terms of the NBL, which was intended to cure ballot manipulation, candidate bias, and voter confusion in furtherance of election integrity and public confidence in the electoral system.

The County Clerk has yet to provide a printer's proof of the Primary Election ballot, as required by statutory law which establishes April 4, 2025 as the deadline for the preparation of official primary election ballots for printing, N.J.S.A. 19:14-1.

April 19, 2025 marks the commencement of mailing of mail-in ballots for the Primary Election, N.J.S.A. 19:63-5, N.J.S.A. 19:63-9, in preparation of the June 10, 2025 Primary Election.

Absent the relief requested, the ballots that will be designed, printed, and/or mailed by the County Clerk on April 19, 2025 in a manner which disobeys the obvious statutory requirement of the NBL and basic principles axiomatic of election law, will foster voter confusion, causing votes for county committee to be discarded, will cause the votes in the Primary Election to be assigned unequal weight, will force voters to forego their full voting rights for the election of candidates for county committee, and will cause the Plaintiffs related harms in securing equal treatment on the ballot, their full associational rights on the ballot, their own voting rights on the ballot, and compromising their supporters' votes.

Absent the temporary and preliminary restraints outlined herein, as well as expedited summary proceedings on the final relief requested by Plaintiffs in the Verified Complaint, the public will be forced to bear the potential expense of a duplicate printing and mailing. Plaintiffs will be forced to bear a violation of their constitutional rights in such a manner that threatens election integrity, thereby affecting the voters of Cherry Hill and Collingswood in Camden County and election outcomes. The County Clerk will be permitted to violate the clear mandate

of her statutorily prescribed duties, and the voting public will be deprived of a ballot that clearly identifies and sets forth candidates in a manner mandated by statute and required under constitutional law – i.e., in a manner that does not discriminate on the basis of association, and that does not foster voter confusion, and allows for each candidate for each office to be duly elected.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

As and for their Statement of Facts, Plaintiffs rely on the contents of the Verified Complaint. (See Y.Bromberg Certification, Exh. A, Verified Complaint and associated exhibits.)

LEGAL ARGUMENT

POINT 1

PLAINTIFFS ARE ENTITLED TO IMMEDIATE AFFIRMATIVE INJUNCTIVE RELIEF AS SET FORTH IN THE ORDER TO SHOW CAUSE

Plaintiffs are entitled to immediate temporary, preliminary, and permanent injunctive relief enjoining the County Clerk from drawing the ballot in a manner inconsistent with constitutional and statutory precepts; transmitting, printing, and/or mailing the vote by mail ballots for the Primary Election; or in any way taking any additional affirmative steps towards providing any public ballot information as to the machine, provisional, vote-by mail, and any other ballot to be issued by the County Clerk for the Primary Election.

Expedited review of this matter is necessary given the deadlines imposed under Title 19 for the preparation of ballots in election, including, as most relevant herein, the overdue April 4, 2025 ballot lay deadline, the April 19, 2025 deadline for the County Clerk to commence the mailing of mail-in ballots for the Primary Election, and the June 10, 2025 date of the Primary Election itself. As this Court is well-aware, election disputes such as this are customarily handled

as an expedited summary proceeding. See R. 4:67; Murray v. Murray, 7 N.J. Super, 549 (Law Div. 1950); McCann v. Clerk of City of Jersey City, 167 N.J. 311, 318-19 (2001); R. 4:52-1(a) (requirements for applications for immediate injunctive relief).

As demonstrated below, Plaintiffs meet the standards for temporary restraints in order to enjoin the County Clerk from acting in a manner that is violative of ballot design laws and related constitutional rights in connection with the approaching June 10, 2025 election.

The legal standard for the issuance of interim relief is well-settled. To obtain interim relief, the moving party must demonstrate that it has a substantial likelihood of prevailing on the merits; that irreparable harm will occur if the requested interim relief is not granted; that the public interest will not be injured by an interim relief order; and the relative hardship to the parties favors the grant of relief. Crowe v. De Gioia, 90 N.J. 126, 132-134 (1983).

A. The Court Should Grant the Temporary Restraining Order

Plaintiffs will suffer immediate and irreparable harm if the temporary restraints they seek are denied. Harm is generally considered irreparable “[i]f it cannot be redressed adequately by monetary damages.” Crowe, 90 N.J. at 133; see also Subcarrier Communications Inc. v. Day, 299 N.J. Super. 634, 638 (App. Div. 1997). In such a case, “[p]ecuniary damages may be inadequate because of the nature of the injury, or the right affected.” Id. at 133. In addition, violations of constitutional rights are presumptively irreparable. See Forum for Academic & Inst. Rights v. Rumsfeld, 390 F.3d 219, 246 (3d Cir. 2004). No monetary award can adequately redress Plaintiffs’ rights in this matter or protect the public’s interest in election integrity, and as such temporary restraints should issue.

The relative hardship to the parties favors relief where there is no administrative burden in implementing a policy that is already in effect in counties across the state, and where the ballot

has yet to be offered in the form of a printer's proof for public inspection, printed, mailed, or voted upon. A balancing of the equities and the relative hardships here militate in favor of interim relief. In general, "the public interest clearly favors the protection of constitutional rights." Tenafly Eruv Ass'n, Inc. v. Borough of Tenafly, 309 F.3d 144, 178 (3d Cir. 2002) (citing Council of Alternative Political Parties v. Hooks, 121 F.3d 876, 884 (3d Cir. 1997)).

Here, the challenge to the Defendant County Clerk's failure to secure an oval or space to afford each candidate for each office, including county committee races, as required by the NBL, will cause a deprivation of substantive constitutional rights of equal protection, the right to vote, and freedom of association, and the implementation of these protections via substantive statutory rights through the NJ Civil Rights Act, N.J.S.A. 19:6-2(c).

Absent temporary restraints, the Clerk will design the ballot for voters of Cherry Hill and Collingswood which will lead to voter disenfranchisement, candidate bias and unequal treatment, and other associated violative statutory and constitutional harms, described in further detail in the Verified Complaint, including subjecting Cherry Hill and Collingswood voters to a real threat of voter confusion in connection with *overvoting* insofar as they will be instructed to "Vote for Seventy-Four" or "Vote for Eighteen," respectively, notwithstanding that they will only be able to select among two options, and subjecting them to a real threat of voter confusion in connection with *undervoting* and being forced to choose between slates because, if they choose to vote for the Plaintiff-Candidates in their respective municipalities, they will forego their right to directly elect their remaining seventy-one (71) and seventeen (17) representatives, and will only be able to actually vote for three (3) and one (1) candidate, respectively. The entire scheme subjects Plaintiff-Candidates to ballot manipulation and unequal treatment on the ballot. (See Y.Bromberg Certification, Exh. B, New Ballot Design Law; Exh. D, Camden County Candidate

Lists; Exh. E, Certifications by six voters of Cherry Hill and Collingswood describing interests and concerns without the ability to exercise their individual voter choices for candidates for county committee.)

B. Plaintiffs are Entitled to Preliminary Injunctive Relief

The legal standard for such an application is set forth in the seminal case of Crowe v. DeGioia, 90 N.J. 126, 132 (1982). Pursuant to the well-known four-part Crowe test, an application for interim injunctive relief will be granted where:

- (1) The party seeking the injunction is reasonably likely to prevail on the merits of its underlying claim;
- (2) The party seeking the injunction is likely to suffer irreparable injury if the injunction is not granted;
- (3) Any undue hardship to the party being enjoined is outweighed by the hardship to the party seeking the injunction; and,
- (4) The public interest will not be harmed if the injunction is granted.

Id. at 132-34. As set forth herein, Plaintiffs meet the requirements of the test for emergent relief to be granted.

1. Plaintiffs are Reasonably Likely to Succeed on the Merits of their Claims.

County clerks, in carrying out their duties, are subject to certain restrictions and obligations, as set forth in the NBL, such that “[a]ll primary election ballots used in this State shall comply with [specific] design standards” including “(1) *the oval or space for the voter to mark a vote shall be to the left or to the right of the name of each candidate, and each candidate’s name shall appear flush next to and aligned with the oval or space in a consistent manner which does not create any visual distinction between candidates.*” (NBL, New Section

2(a)(1) (emphasis added.) (See Y.Bromberg Certification, Exhibit B, New Ballot Law, P.L. 2025).

The NBL requires that “all office blocks appearing on one ballot shall be designed according to the same standards of design, consistent with the provisions of this section” and prescribes related duties for county clerks. (NBL, New Section 2(a)(4).)

The NBL specifies text to be printed on the ballot to “instructing the voter how to indicate the *voter’s choice for each office and position*, and for how many persons to vote for *each* office and position: To vote for any person whose name is printed on this ballot mark a cross x, plus +, check, or an otherwise appropriate mark on *the oval or space next to the name of such person.*” (N.J.S.A. 19:23-25, as amended by NBL.)

The NBL further amends N.J.S.A. 19:23-25 in specifying the design of each office block, such that “*Immediately next to the name of each candidate for office and position shall be printed an oval or space in which the voter shall indicate the voter’s choice.*” (N.J.S.A. 19:23-25, as amended by NBL.)

Simply put, the NBL could not be clearer on this point. It creates no exceptions, and provides the County Clerks no discretion. It is a mandate.

From the failure to follow this mandate flows outcomes which are anathema to the basic conduct of free and fair elections. For example, as described further in the Verified Complaint, voters will be forced to choose between slates for county committee, such that they will have to forego their right to elect individual candidates for office, notwithstanding their associated slogans, and even across associated slogans. (See e.g., Y.Bromberg Certification, Exh. E, Certification by voters of Cherry Hill and Collingswood.) And, because one slate in Cherry Hill is comprised of three candidates for county committee, the voters who wish to elect any one of

those candidates will only be able to effectively vote for three candidates to elect them, notwithstanding that it is a “Vote for Seventy-Four” (74) race. In other words, the voters of Cherry Hill are forced to choose to vote for a slate of three, and forego their right to vote for seventy-one (71) candidates, or vote for a slate of seventy-four (74) candidates notwithstanding that all or some portion of the slate of three is comprised of their candidates of choice. (See Exh. D, Camden County Candidate Lists for 2025.) Moreover, the NBL provides specific instruction that the “Vote for Seventy-Four” race be listed on the ballot – which will surely cause voter confusion and overvotes, resulting in discarded votes, because the voters will effectively only have the option to vote for one of two options. The same analysis applies to the voters for county committee races in Collingswood, where neighbors are being forced to choose between a slate of one and a slate of eighteen, notwithstanding that they may want to vote for Plaintiff-Candidate Kate Delany and also various candidates listed among the slate of eighteen, and notwithstanding that they currently have to choose between voting for one candidate on one slate and therefore forego their right to select seventeen (17) other candidates for office.

Voting in New Jersey is not prix-fixe. It is à la carte. The NBL is replete with explicit direction mandating county clerks to design ballots such that voters are to select each candidate of their choice, and that “each candidate” is afforded a separate oval or space for the voters to exercise their “voter choice.”

After extensive public hearings on ballot design to cure the extreme outlier and national embarrassment of New Jersey’s primary ballot design, the legislature came together to remedy ballot manipulation to restore the rights of the candidates and the voters. Not a single amendment or contention was raised by the Camden County delegation during this process with regard to the multiple express directions in the NBL that an oval or space be adjoined to each candidate for

each office. Notably, the Defendant County Clerk was herself a member of the Assembly until the effective date of her new tenure as county clerk, and herself voted for prior reiterations of the Assembly bill – which contained identical verbatim language prescribing a single oval or space to each candidate and each office, and for ballot standardization within and across office blocks. *See* Assembly No. 5116, 2d Reprint, December 19, 2024, and related Roll Call, *available at*: <https://www.njleg.state.nj.us/bill-search/2024/A5116>, *compare with* NBL.

The ballots used in Camden County demonstrate internal inconsistencies with the use of ovals for each county committee race in years prior, demonstrate space on the ballot for the availability of a single oval for each candidate for committee, and demonstrate that voters have in the past been able to select their voter choices on the second page of the ballot. (See Exh. F, collection of prior Camden County ballots.) The passage of the NBL marked a watershed moment for democracy in New Jersey, and cured longstanding issues endemic on the corrupt and corrupting design of the primary ballot.

In passing the NBL, the legislature recognized that the “design of the new primary ballot preserves the ability of political parties to make endorsements, since party labels provide a shorthand designation of the views of party candidates, and the identification of candidates within a particular party plays a role in the process by which voters inform themselves of the exercise of the franchise.” (NBL, New section 1(l)). The legislature further recognized that the “design also takes into consideration the First Amendment rights of political parties and their governing bodies, recognizing that primary elections are, at their core, a function of the party and therefore not a public affair which may be overly regulated by the State. This principle has routinely been upheld by the United States Supreme Court and the courts in New Jersey.” (NBL, New section 1(m)). And, notably, the legislature balanced those rights with the rights it

recognized as being held by the voters and the candidates to secure a fair and free election – and in doing so, expressly legislated for the election of each candidate for each office and that an oval or space be so affixed and flushed to ensure standard ballot design within and among office blocks.

While “courts normally defer to the expertise of the county clerks regarding ballot design . . . [t]his does not, however, preclude our intervention when county clerks fail to apply that expertise in a manner that accords with” prevailing law. Andrews v. Rajoppi, 2008 WL 18699869, *3 (App. Div. 2008) (rejecting several county clerks’ listing of senate candidates in two columns, as opposed to one, in violation of N.J.S.A. 19:23-26.1). Similarly here, there is no confusion in the law’s mandate. Nonetheless, it should be noted that New Jersey courts have long held that “[e]lection laws are to be liberally construed so as to effectuate their purpose,” and “should not be construed so as to deprive voters of their franchise or so as to render an election void for technical reasons.” Kilmurray v. Gilfert, 10 N.J. 435, 440 (1952) (citations omitted); see also In re Ross, 116 N.J. Super. 178, 184 (App. Div. 1971) (It is a “well-established principle that our election laws are to be given a liberal construction in order to effectuate a public policy in favor of the enfranchisement of voters.”) (citing Wene v. Meyner, 13 N.J. 185, 197 (1953)); In re Chirico, 87 N.J. Super. 587, 592-93 (App. Div. 1965) (“[W]e perceive an evident legislative purpose to afford the electorate maximum opportunity to vote on those names [sic] have been put forward by nomination. The opportunity of voters to express their choice at a primary election should not be diminished by too narrow a reading of *chapter 23 of Title 19*.”). Therefore, the public interest favors submitting to the electorate ballots that contain the names of all candidates for groups and parties that are qualified. See Kilmurray, 10 N.J. at 441; Madden v. Hegadorn, 236 N.J. Super. 280, 287 (Law Div. 1989). It is a basic premise of elections that the voters vote for their preferred

candidates on the ballot, and the NBL accordingly specified as it relates to an oval for each candidate and each office.

Indeed, with respect to our elections, New Jersey's Legislature intended "to promote participation in the candidate-selection process, and to give voters more choices in a primary election." Lesniak v. Budzash, 133 N.J. 1, 17 (1993); see also N.J. Democratic Party, Inc. v. Samson, 175 N.J. 178, 190 (2002) (Legislature intended that election laws "will be interpreted to allow the greatest scope for public participation in the electoral process, to allow candidates to get on the ballot, to allow parties to put their candidates on the ballot, and most importantly to allow the voters a choice on Election Day.") (citation and quotation marks omitted).

2. Plaintiffs will Suffer Irreparable Harm if the Injunction is Not Granted, and the Balance of Harms and Public Interest Weigh in Favor of Granting the Injunction.

Here, Plaintiffs merely ask this court to enjoin the Clerk from designing, printing, and mailing ballots in connection with Cherry Hill and Collingswood for the June 10, 2025 Democratic Primary Election, pending resolution of this matter. Plaintiffs will suffer immediate and irreparable harm if the temporary restraints they seek are denied. As set forth above, if these actions were to occur prior to resolution of this matter, Plaintiffs would suffer irreparable harm as it cannot be adequately redressed by monetary damages. See Crowe, 90 N.J. at 132-34; Ispahani v. Allied Domecq Retail, 320 N.J. Super. 494 (App. Div. 1999). No monetary award can adequately redress Plaintiffs' rights in this matter or protect the public interest.

Furthermore, the printer proof has yet to be shown to the public, and the ballots have yet to be printed, thus no costs associated with printing ballots or confusion stemming from the printing of different ballots has yet to occurred. Indeed, the public interest would be harmed if the

ballots were prepared, printed, and mailed out, and then a subsequent decision of this Court were to be issued requiring the inclusion of additional ovals or spaces appear alongside each candidate for county committee on the Cherry Hill and Collingswood ballots. Therefore, an injunction should issue directing the County Clerk accordingly, until such time as a review can be conducted by this Court.

C. This Matter should be Heard on a Summary or Expedited Basis

Plaintiffs further believe that this matter should be heard on a summary or expedited basis, pursuant to R. 4:67-1 and/or N.J.S.A. 19:13-12. That statute provides, in pertinent part, that:

. . . a judge of the Superior Court assigned to the county in which any petition of nomination shall be filed, on the application or complaint, duly verified, of any candidate, which application or complaint shall be made on or before the twelfth day after the last day for the filing of petitions, setting forth any invasion or threatened invasion of his rights under the petition of nomination filed with . . . any county clerk, shall hear such application or complaint in a summary way and make such order thereon as will protect and enforce the rights of such candidates, which order or determination shall be filed within three days after the filing of the application or complaint.

Plaintiffs have met the statutory requirements of filing a verified complaint within the time frame envisioned by the statute, and have presented in the foregoing argument how their rights have been invaded by the improper actions of the Clerk. While N.J.S.A. 19:13-12 does not expressly state that it applies to ballot design issues, by implication the procedure set forth in the statute would be the only sensible approach, given the statutory deadlines that apply to the preparing, printing, and dissemination of ballots. Our Supreme Court has previously stated that “the expression ‘invasion or threatened invasion’ of the rights of ‘any’ candidate ought to be construed broadly when resort is had to court action.” Sadloch v. Allan, 25 N.J. 118, 129 (1957). Thus, to the extent that proceeding as a typical Action in Lieu of Prerogative Writs would present difficulties in

administration and timeliness, N.J.S.A. 19:13-12 provides an appropriate framework for expedited disposition. Accordingly, Plaintiffs request the most expedited possible review of their application and are prepared to appear before the Court as soon as practicable.

CONCLUSION

For the foregoing reasons, Plaintiffs respect that the Court grant their application for injunctive relief.



24 ³~~[(7)] (4)~~³ all office blocks appearing on one ballot shall be
25 designed according to the same standards of design, consistent with
26 the provisions of this section; ³~~and~~

27 (8)³ (5)³ all spacing, ruling, and delineation of candidates shall be
28 consistent and uniform within each office block and across all office
29 blocks included on each ballot, so as not to create a separation or
30 visual distinction between the names of any candidates^{1 3}; and

31 (6) candidate ballot draw positions shall be labeled using a letter
32 and number, such as "1A", corresponding to the office block and line
33 each candidate is placed on, and such label shall be placed next to a
34 candidate's name³.

35 b. No primary election ballot used in this State shall be designed
36 in a manner that creates for a candidate on the ballot an incongruous
37 separation from other candidates seeking the same office, positions a
38 candidate on the ballot among candidates for a different office, or
39 brackets candidates together on the ballot so as to position a candidate
40 based upon a drawing for ballot position for a different candidate for a
41 different office.

42 No primary election ballot used in this State shall include any
43 distinguishing mark or notation, except as otherwise provided by law.

44 c. Each county clerk shall:

45 (1) allow for the placement of a slogan or endorsement of not
46 more than six words next to or below the names of candidates, in the
47 same font and color as the name, but in a smaller font size, provided

1 that the slogan or endorsement shall not be in bold or italicized fonts,
2 and provided that the slogan or endorsement complies with R.S.19:23-

4 (2) allow candidates for the same office with multiple open seats
5 to associate in the same office block, using a common slogan or

7 compliance with the provisions of R.S.19:23-18; and

8 (3) indicate the association of candidates ¹for the same or different
9 offices¹ using a common slogan or endorsement next to or below each

11 d. In addition to complying with the provisions of this section,
12 each county clerk may arrange and design the ballot in either
13 landscape or portrait orientation.

14 e. The Secretary of State, in consultation with all county clerks,
15 shall promulgate uniform guidelines for all county clerks to follow in
16 order to comply with the requirements of this section.

36 nomination unless the written consent of such person or
37 incorporated association ³[of this State]³ has been filed with the
38 petition of nomination of such candidate or ~~group of~~ candidates.
39 ¹If a person or incorporated association wishes to revoke their
40 consent as provided pursuant to this subsection, the person or
41 incorporated association shall notify the Secretary of State, county
42 clerk, or municipal clerk, as the case may be, in writing and the
43 Secretary of State or the clerk shall accept such revocation,
44 provided that notice of such is received prior to the date on which
45 the draw for ballot position is conducted pursuant to R.S.19:23-24.¹

1 ³(2) No slogan or endorsement shall include or refer to any
2 lawfully registered trademark of any person or incorporated
3 association unless the written consent of such person or
4 incorporated association has been filed with the petition of
5 nomination of such candidate or candidates. If a person or
6 incorporated association wishes to revoke their consent as provided
7 pursuant to this paragraph, the person or incorporated association
8 shall notify the Secretary of State, county clerk, or municipal clerk,
9 as the case may be, in writing and the Secretary of State or the clerk
10 shall accept such revocation, provided that notice of such is
11 received prior to the date on which the draw for ballot position is
12 conducted pursuant to R.S.19:23-24.³

13 c. ¹[No slogan or endorsement shall include or refer to the
14 name of any political party, as defined under R.S.19:1-1, unless the
15 written consent of the respective county political committee of such
16 political party has been filed with the petition of nomination of such
17 candidate or candidates.] The Secretary of State, county clerk, or
18 municipal clerk, as the case may be, may reject a slogan or
19 endorsement which is so substantially similar to that of another
20 candidate that a reasonable voter could be misled or deceived into
21 falsely believing that the candidates are running together under the
22 same slogan or endorsement when the candidates have not
23 requested to share such a slogan or endorsement. The Secretary of
24 State, county clerk, or municipal clerk, as the case may be, shall
25 notify the candidate or candidates requesting such slogan or
26 endorsement in writing of the reasons for the rejection, and the
27 candidate or candidates shall be given the opportunity to select an
28 alternative slogan or endorsement.

29 If the candidate or candidates who have been denied their first
30 choice of slogan or endorsement pursuant to this section disagree
31 with the decision of the Secretary of State, county clerk, or
32 municipal clerk, as the case may be, the candidate or candidates
33 shall have the right to appeal this decision to a judge of the Superior
34 Court assigned to the county in which the petition of nomination
35 was filed, and such appeal shall be heard on an expedited basis.¹

36 d. No slogan or endorsement shall include or refer to the name
37 of any candidate appearing on the ballot in the same primary
38 election for a different office.

39 ¹e. Nothing in this section shall be construed to prohibit the use
40 of a single word referring to the membership or affiliation of a
41 person with a political party, as defined under R.S.19:1-1, such as
42 “Democrat” or “Republican”, in a candidate’s slogan.¹

45 4. R.S.19:23-18 is amended to read as follows:

46 19:23-18. a. Several candidates for nomination to the same
47 office with multiple open seats to be voted on at a primary election
48 may in such petitions request that their names be [grouped

25 c. If multiple candidates or associations of candidates shall
 26 receive the endorsement of the same person or incorporated
 27 association, such endorsement shall be printed next to or below all
 28 candidates having indicated such endorsement on their petitions of
 29 nomination, as permitted by R.S.19:23-17.

30 d. If candidates have requested to be associated pursuant to
 31 subsection a. of this section, the associated candidates shall be
 32 drawn together for position on the ballot pursuant to R.S.19:23-24.
 33 The candidates, on their petitions, shall waive their right to be
 34 drawn separately for ballot position.

38 19:23-24. a. The position which the candidates [and bracketed

11 voters of their respective municipality or a subdivision thereof]³ .

12 The position on the ballot used for the primary election for the
13 general election in the case of candidates for nomination for office
14 [or party position] ³or party position³ wherein the candidates for
15 office [or party position] ³or party position³ to be filled are to be
16 voted for by the voters of a municipality only, or a subdivision
17 thereof (excepting in the case of members of the House of
18 Representatives) ³, which nominating petitions are required to be
19 filed in the municipal clerk's office,³ shall be determined by the
20 municipal clerk in such municipalities, [in the following manner:]
21 except that, upon ³[the request of] written notice by the county
22 clerk to³ the municipal clerk, the county clerk shall determine the
23 position on the ballot for such offices ³or party positions³ .

24 The position which the candidates shall have upon the ballots

27 b. The county clerk, or the county clerk's deputy, or the
28 municipal clerk or the municipal clerk's deputy, as the case may be,
29 shall at the clerk's office on the 61st day prior to the primary
30 election for the general election at three o'clock in the afternoon
31 draw from the box, as hereinafter described, each card separately
32 without knowledge on the clerk's part as to which card the clerk is
33 drawing. Any legal voter of the county or municipality, as the case
34 may be, shall have the privilege of witnessing such drawing. The

36 drawing of each name, the order in which the same is drawn, and

17 treated as one name and shall be drawn only once under subsection
18 b. of this section.

19 d. As prohibited by section 2 of P.L. , c. (C.) (pending
20 before the Legislature as this bill), no candidate shall have their
21 position on the ballot determined by the position of any candidate
22 for a different office.

23 e. (1) If there is only one candidate for an office to be voted
24 on at the primary election, the candidate shall be placed first in the
25 office block for the respective office being sought, and the drawing
26 procedures described in subsection b. of this section shall not be
27 required.

28 (2) If there are an equal number of candidates and open seats for
29 an office, and all the candidates seeking the office have filed a
30 petition of nomination indicating their intention to associate on the
31 ballot pursuant to R.S.19:23-18, the candidates shall be placed upon
32 the ballot in the order requested on their petitions of nomination,
33 and the drawing procedures described in subsection b. of this
34 section shall not be required.

35 f. The county clerk in certifying to the municipal clerk the
36 offices to be filled and the names of candidates to be printed upon

6 19:23-25. The ballots shall be made up and printed consistent
7 with the requirements of section 2 of P.L. , c. (C.) (pending

10 【Each ballot shall have at the top a coupon at least two inches
11 deep extending across the ballot above a perforated line. The
12 coupon shall be numbered for each of the political parties,
13 respectively, from one consecutively to the number of ballots
14 delivered and received by the election officers of the respective
15 polling places. Upon the coupon and above the perforated line shall
16 be the words "To be torn off by the judge of election. Fold to this
17 line." Below the perforated line】 At the top of each ballot shall be

20 naming the proper political party, as provided in this Title; below

26 blank spaces shall be filled in with the name of the proper 'county,'
27 municipality, the ward and the district number and the date of
28 election. The name of the '[municipal] county' clerk shall be a
29 facsimile of 【his】 the '[municipal] county' clerk's signature. This
30 heading shall be set apart from the body of the ballot by a heavy
31 diagram rule. Below this rule shall be printed the following
32 directions instructing the voter how to indicate 【his】 the voter's
33 choice for each office and position, and for how many persons to
34 vote for each office and position: To vote for any person whose
35 name is printed upon this ballot mark a cross x , plus + 【or】 ₂ check
36 【with ink or pencil in the square at the left of】 , or an otherwise
37 appropriate mark on the oval or space next to the name of such
38 person. To vote for any person whose name is not printed upon this
39 ballot write or paste the name in the blank space under the proper
40 title of office and mark a cross x , plus + 【or】 ₂ check 【with ink or
41 pencil in the square at the left of】 , or an otherwise appropriate
42 mark on the oval or space next to the name of such person. Below
43 these instructions shall be printed a heavy diagram rule below
44 which shall be printed the government levels describing the offices
45 to be voted for below which shall be separate office blocks headed
46 by the titles of offices and positions for which candidates are to be
47 voted for at the primary election, together with such directions to

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1 the voter as may be necessary ³[, as] ³ "Vote for one," "Vote for
2 two," or a greater number, as the case may be ³, shall be included
3 with any other directions to the voters, and shall be printed in an
4 obvious and conspicuous manner³.

5 The office blocks shall be arranged in the following order:

6 (1) federal offices, below which shall be printed separate office
7 blocks for choice for President or electors for President; members
8 of the United States Senate; and members of the House of

10 (2) State offices, below which shall be printed separate office
11 blocks for Governor; members of the State Senate; and members of
12 the General Assembly;

13 (3) countywide offices, below which shall be printed separate
14 office blocks for county executive; member of the board of county
15 commissioners; ³county clerk; county sheriff;³ and any other county
16 offices in their respective office blocks;

17 (4) municipal offices, below which shall be printed separate
18 office blocks for mayor; member of the council or municipal
19 governing body; and any other municipal offices in their respective
20 office blocks;

21 (5) any other titles of office, below which shall be printed
22 separate office blocks for each office;

23 (6) delegates and alternates-at-large to the national conventions
24 of political parties, provided that the candidates for delegates and
25 alternates-at-large may be placed next to the office block for choice
26 for President or electors for President;

27 (7) district delegates and alternates to conventions of political
28 parties, provided that the candidates for district delegates and
29 alternates may be placed next to the office block for choice for
30 President or electors for President;

31 ³[(8) candidates for State party positions;]³ and

32 ³[(9)] (8)³ candidates for county party positions.

33 A heavy diagram rule shall be used to distinguish each office
34 block for the different offices. Underneath the proper title of office
35 and position shall be printed the names of all those persons certified
36 as candidates for the offices to the municipal clerk by the county
37 clerk as hereinbefore provided, and the names of persons
38 **[indorsed]** endorsed as such candidates in petitions on file in the
39 office of the municipal clerk as they appear signed to the certificate
40 of acceptance. The name of any person **[indorsed]** endorsed in a
41 petition as provided who shall fail to certify **[his]** the person's
42 consent and agreement to be a candidate for nomination to the
43 office specified therein shall not be printed upon the ballots to be
44 used at the primary election. In the case of a vacancy among
45 nominees the name of the person selected in the manner provided in
46 this Title to fill the same shall be printed upon the ballots in the

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1 The candidates shall be arranged **[in groups and the groups**
 2 **bracketed]** as indicated on their petitions for nomination for the

 5 R.S.19:23-18 request **[such grouping]** for such candidates to be
 6 associated within the same office block. The **[designation]** slogan
 7 or endorsement named by candidates in their petitions for
 8 nomination, as provided by **[this Title]** R.S.19:23-17, shall be
 9 printed **[to the right of]** next to or below the names of such
 10 candidates **[or groups of candidates in as large type as the space**
 11 **will allow]**.

12 Immediately next to **[the left and on the same line with]** the
 13 name of each candidate for office and position shall be printed **[a**
 14 **square approximately one-quarter of an inch in size, or by printing**
 15 **vertical single line rules connecting the single line rules between**
 16 **the names of the candidates and thus form a square]** an oval or
 17 space in which the voter shall indicate **[his]** the voter's choice. **[A**
 18 **single light-faced rule shall be used to separate the different names**
 19 **in each group of candidates.]** A heavy diagram rule shall be used
 20 between each **[group of candidates for different offices**. Where
 21 candidates are arranged in groups and the groups bracketed, the
 22 groups shall be separated from other groups and candidates by two
 23 single line rules approximately one-eighth of an inch apart] office
 24 block. The ballot shall be so arranged that all candidates seeking
 25 the same office are listed in one contiguous office block. No
 26 candidate shall be separated from other candidates seeking the same
 27 office on the ballot.

28 Each primary ballot shall contain, at the end of the list of
 29 candidates for each different office, blank **[squares and]** spaces or
 30 lines equal to the number of persons to be elected to the office, for
 31 the purpose of allowing any voter to write or paste the name of any
 32 person for whom **[he]** the voter desires to vote for any office or
 33 party position.

 36 7. R.S.19:49-2 is amended to read as follows:

37 19:49-2. All official general election ballots shall be in black ink
 38 in type as large as space will reasonably permit; provided, however,
 39 that **[any public question which shall be placed on the ballot shall**
 40 **be in red and]** above any public question to be voted upon by the
 41 voters of the entire State there shall be **[, also in red,]** a description
 42 of the public question, which description shall not exceed six words
 43 and shall be in type as large as is practicable. Party nominations
 44 shall be arranged on each voting machine, either in columns or
 45 horizontal rows; the caption of the various ballots on the machines
 46 shall be so placed on the machines as to indicate to the voter what

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1 device is to be used or operated in order to vote for the candidates
2 or candidate of **【his or her】** the voter's choice. The providing of the
3 official ballots, the order of the precedence and arrangement of
4 parties and of candidates, and the instructions for the use of a
5 device to be used or operated in order to vote for candidates shall be
6 as now required by law **【**, except that in those counties where
7 voting machines are used, the**】** . The county clerk in every county
8 shall have the authority to determine the specifications for, and the
9 final arrangement of, the official general election ballots, to the
10 extent not inconsistent with the provisions of this Title.

11 **【**For the primary election for the general election in all counties
12 where voting machines are or shall be used, all candidates who shall
13 file a joint petition with the county clerk of their respective county
14 and who shall choose the same designation or slogan shall be drawn
15 for position on the ballot as a unit and shall have their names placed
16 on the same line of the voting machine; and provided further, that
17 all candidates for municipal or party office in municipalities in
18 counties where voting machines are or shall be used who shall file a
19 petition with the clerk of their municipality bearing the same
20 designation or slogan as that of the candidates filing a joint petition
21 with the county clerk as aforesaid, may request that his or her name
22 be placed on the same line of the voting machine with the
23 candidates who have filed a joint petition with the county clerk as
24 aforesaid by so notifying the county clerk of said county in writing
25 within two days after the last day for filing nominating petitions and
26 thereupon the county clerk shall forthwith notify the campaign
27 manager of such candidates filing a joint petition as aforesaid of
28 said request, and if the said campaign manager shall file his consent
29 in writing with the said county clerk within two days after the
30 receipt of said notification from said county clerk, the clerk of said
31 county shall place the name of such candidate on the same line of
32 the voting machine on which appears the names of the candidates
33 who have filed the joint petition as aforesaid; provided, also, that
34 any candidate filing a petition with the Attorney General may
35 request that his or her name be placed on the same line of the voting
36 machine with the candidates who have filed a joint petition with the
37 county clerk as aforesaid by so notifying the county clerk of said
38 county in writing within two days after the last day for filing
39 nominating petitions, and thereupon the county clerk shall forthwith
40 notify the campaign manager of such candidates filing a joint
41 petition as aforesaid of said request, and if the said campaign
42 manager shall file his consent in writing with the said county clerk
43 within two days after the receipt of said notification from said
44 county clerk, the clerk of said county shall place the name of such
45 candidate on the same line of the voting machine on which appears
46 the names of the candidates who have filed the joint petition as
47 aforesaid.**】**

48 (cf: P.L.2011, c.202, s.46)

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1 8. (New section) a. The Division of Elections in the
2 Department of State shall collect data from county and municipal
3 clerks and county boards of elections on their experiences regarding
4 the changes to ballot design and primary election procedures in this
5 State implemented pursuant to P.L. , c. (pending before the
6 Legislature as this bill), and shall develop and submit a report as
7 provided in this section. The report shall include data concerning
8 the conduct of primary elections, best practices to improve the
9 conduct of future primary elections, and any other relevant
10 information, research, guidance, and expertise regarding the
11 implementation of the new ballot designs and primary election
12 procedures.

13 b. In preparing the report required pursuant to this section, the
14 division shall, at a minimum, collect data on the following:

15 (1) experiences of election officials, candidates, and voters
16 regarding the ballot changes, including whether such changes
17 contributed to candidate or voter confusion, or increased the
18 difficulty for election officials to administer primary elections in
19 this State; and

20 (2) what the costs of implementation were.

21 At the discretion of the division, the report may also provide the
22 Governor and the Legislature with recommendations to improve
23 overall election experiences and voter participation.

24 c. The report shall be prepared and submitted to the Governor,
25 and Legislature pursuant to section 2 of P.L.1991, c.164 (C.52:14-
26 19.1), within 180 days after the date of the second primary election
27 following the enactment of P.L. , c. (pending before the
28 Legislature as this bill).

New Voting Machines in Camden County

Integrity and security are essential to free and fair elections. With our aging election equipment and voting machines at the end of life, the decision was made to purchase new equipment. The new election systems will not put into service by Camden County will not only ensure our elections are completely secure, but also easy to use from the perspective of our voters.

Here is what you can expect the next time you cast your vote at a polling place in Camden County.

- **Sign In:** You will sign in on an electronic tablet device, speeding up the process and assuring you receive the ballot for your district.
 - **Your Ballot:** Upon signing in, the board workers will give you your ballot. Ballots are paper and are similar to those who vote using a Vote by Mail ballot. You will be directed to a privacy screen where you will make your selections using a pen to vote for the candidates and questions by coloring in the corresponding oval.
 - **Voting Machines:** After you have voted your ballot, place it in a provided privacy sleeve to keep all voting selections secret. A board worker will then direct you to the new tabulating device. You will then feed your ballot into the scanner where your votes will be recorded, and your ballot is securely stored within the device. This ensures that there is a paper record of every single vote that has been cast.
 - **Ballot Marking Devices:** Every polling location throughout Camden County will be equipped with an ADA compliant ballot marking device. Voters that require such accommodations will be able to utilize the Express Vote machine which will assist the voters in making selections on their ballot. Ballots printed from the ballot marking device are read on the tabulators the same as any other ballot.
- While some see this as a regression from fully electronic machines, it is widely believed by election security experts that a hand-marked paper ballot are the most secure method of voting since voter intent is clear and each ballot can easily be recounted if needed.

We look forward to all Camden County voters having the opportunity to cast their vote for our upcoming elections!

Nuevas Máquinas de Votación en el Condado de Camden

La integridad y la seguridad son esenciales para elecciones justas y democráticas. Con nuestro equipo electoral y nuestras máquinas de votación obsoletas, ya era necesario que se actualizarán. Por eso se tomó la decisión de comprar equipo nuevo. Los nuevos sistemas electorales puestos en servicio por el Condado de Camden no solo garantizarán que nuestras elecciones sean completamente seguras, sino también fáciles de usar desde la perspectiva de nuestros votantes.

Esto es lo que puede esperar la próxima vez que emita su voto en un lugar de votación en el Condado de Camden.

- **Firmar:** Inicialá la sesión en una tableta electrónica, acelerando el proceso y asegurándose de recibir la papeleta para su distrito.

 - **Dispositivo de marcado de Papeletas:** Cada lugar de votación en todo el Condado de Camden estará equipado con un dispositivo de marcado de papeletas que cumple con la ADA. Los votantes que requieran dichas adaptaciones podrán utilizar la máquina Expreso de Votar, que los ayudará a realizar las selecciones en su papeleta. New Voting Machines in Camden County



Integrity and security are essential to free and fair elections. With our aging election equipment and voting machines at the end of life, the decision was made to purchase new equipment. The new election systems will not put into service by Camden County will not only ensure our elections are completely secure, but also easy to use from the perspective of our voters.

Here is what you can expect the next time you cast your vote at a polling place in Camden County.

- Sign In: You will sign in on an electronic tablet device, speeding up the process and assuring you receive the ballot for your district.
• Your Ballot: Upon signing in, the board workers will give you your ballot. Ballots are paper and are similar to those who vote using a Vote by Mail ballot. You will be directed to a privacy screen where you will make your selections using a pen to vote for the candidates and questions by coloring in the corresponding oval.
• Voting Machines: After you have voted your ballot, place it in a provided privacy sleeve to keep all voting selections secret. A board worker will then direct you to the new tabulating device. You will then feed your ballot into the scanner where your votes will be recorded, and your ballot is securely stored within the device. This ensures that there is a paper record of every single vote that has been cast.
• Ballot Marking Device: Every polling location throughout Camden County will be equipped with an ADA compliant ballot marking device. Voters that require such accommodations will be able to utilize the Express Vote machine which will assist the voters in making selections on their ballot. Ballots printed from the ballot marking device are read on the tabulators the same as any other ballot.
While some see this as a regression from fully electronic machines, it is widely believed by election security experts that a hand-marked paper ballot are the most secure method of voting since voter intent is clear and each ballot can easily be recounted if needed.

We look forward to all Camden County voters having the opportunity to cast their vote for our upcoming elections!

Nuevas Máquinas de Votación en el Condado de Camden

• Máquinas de votación: Después de haber votado en su papeleta, colóquela en una carpeta privada provista para mantener en secreto todas las selecciones de votación. Luego, ingresará su papeleta en el escáner donde se registrarán sus votos, y su papeleta se almacenará de forma segura dentro del dispositivo. Esto asegura que haya un registro en papel de cada voto que se haya emitido.
• Dispositivo de marcado de Papeletas: Cada lugar de votación en todo el Condado de Camden estará equipado con un dispositivo de marcado de papeletas que cumple con la ADA. Los votantes que requieran dichas adaptaciones podrán utilizar la máquina Expreso de Votar, que los ayudará a realizar las selecciones en su papeleta. Las papeletas impresas desde el dispositivo de marcado de papeletas se leen en los tabuladores de la misma manera que cualquier otra papeleta.
Mientras algunos ven esto como una regresión de las máquinas totalmente electrónicas, los expertos en seguridad electoral creen ampliamente que una papeleta de papel marcada a mano es el método más seguro para votar, ya que la intención del votante es clara y cada papeleta se puede volver a contar fácilmente si es necesario.

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
